**Course Description:**

Community Art Program (CAP) should be of special interest to students interested in the role of the teaching artist or designer in the community. This field-based course provides students with a service-learning opportunity to explore the dynamics of community-based arts programming for urban youth. Additionally, the course will examine issues and challenges in community arts practices and programming through research, readings, presentations, and a final art project. Students will keep a journal throughout the course to document and reflect on their educational experiences as a student, teacher, and artist.

**Course Overview:**

This course is organized as both a seminar and service-learning opportunity. The course, which is based at iCityArts!, a Providence community arts center, will enable course members to utilize her/his knowledge and skills as an artist or designer to develop creative learning opportunities for young people. Each class will begin with an hour and a half seminar where students will come prepared to discuss readings and topics related to community-based arts and education. Following seminar, students will break into their designated teaching teams to prepare and lead a small group of youth in a project.

Seminar guests, representing varieties of expertise and interests related to community arts education will join the class throughout the semester to provide students with a sense of the diversity of community based art practices and programming.

**Course Objectives:**

The objective of this course is to provide students with a broad introduction to topics relevant to community arts education and service learning. Through participation in this course RISD students will be able to:

- Draw upon their own artistic and design sensibilities to research, plan, and implement a series of art experiences for a youth at iCityArts!
- Read, discuss and make informed decisions regarding the content of topics related to community-based arts education.
- Research, plan, and mount an exhibition of the visual work created by both the RISD students and the students at iCityArts!

## **Course Requirements & Evaluation Criteria:**

1. ***Planning and teaching assignments with iCityArts! youth.***  
*All assignments will be developed with a group of your peers.*

Some things to remember:

- Be prepared and organized for your teaching experience.
- Projects should be inspiring and relevant to the lives of your students – don't be afraid to "think outside the box" when developing assignments.
- Always provide visual references and be prepared to demonstrate new media and techniques
- Introduce and highlight new vocabulary with each assignment
- Ask your students questions to check for understanding

2. ***Seminar Participation:***

- Please be on time and come prepared to discuss readings with questions and opinions.

3. ***Journal Entries:***

- Your journal is a place for you to reflect on your teaching and learning experiences throughout this semester. We will prompt your written reflections with questions, but you should feel free to interpret your experiences through artwork in your journals as well.

4. ***In-Class Presentations:***

- Presentations should be well researched and include visual references. If you choose to make presentations in PowerPoint, we will have a projector, laptop, and connector cables available for your use but please let us know in advance if you will require any of these things.

5. ***Mid-term Research Project and Presentation:***

- Your mid-term project will be to research and present either a community arts organization or the work of a community-based artist to the class.

6. ***Final Studio Assignment:***

- Your studio piece can be carried out in any medium, and should be a visual response to a topic, theme, or experience covered in this course.

### **Attendance and Grading Policy:**

The nature of this course is that you are working collaboratively with your teaching team to provide art experiences for youth at iCityArts! Unexcused absences will not only impact your classmates but the iCityArts! students as well. Therefore we expect and encourage you to be on time and present at all class meetings.

**Journal Assignment:** Reflect on a meaningful art making experience that you had in an art classroom—either in school or as part of an after-school/community-based arts program.
